RE: CLOSURE OF VIRGINIA'S DIRECTED OFFSHORE SUMMER

FLOUNDER FISHERY

Effective 11:59 P.M., Eastern Daylight Time (EDT), Monday, April 30, 2018, the Directed Virginia Offshore Summer Flounder Fishery will close. Vessels that have entered Virginia waters and secured to an offloading site prior to 11:59 P.M., EDT, Monday, April 30, 2018, may possess and offload up to 7,500 pounds of summer flounder, minus any previous landings since March 1, 2018.

Therefore, after 11:59 P.M., EDT, Monday, April 30, 2018, it shall be unlawful for any person harvesting Summer Flounder outside of Virginia's waters to do any of the following:

- 1. Possess on board any vessel in Virginia waters any amount of Summer Flounder, in excess of 10% by weight, of Atlantic croaker or the combined landings, on board a vessel, of black sea bass, scup, squid, scallops and Atlantic mackerel.
- 2. Possess on board any vessel in Virginia waters any amount of Summer Flounder, in excess of 1,500 pounds, landed in combination with Atlantic croaker.
- 3. Fail to land and sell the vessel's entire harvest at the point of landing.

The bycatch provisions above will be in place after 11:59 P.M., EDT, Monday, April 30, 2018 until the second opening of the Directed Offshore Fishery. Only vessels holding a valid Virginia Summer Flounder Endorsement License may possess summer flounder harvested outside of Virginia's waters. The buyer shall continue to contact the Marine Resources Commission Operations Station prior to a vessel offloading any summer flounder harvested outside Virginia.

The buyer shall provide Operations Station (757-247-2265 or 1-800-541-4646) the name of the vessel, captain's name and the anticipated or approximate offloading time. Once offloading of any vessel is complete and the weight of the landed summer flounder has been determined, the

buyer shall contact the Marine Resources Commission Operations Station and report the vessel name and corresponding weight of summer flounder landed. It shall be unlawful for any person to offload from a boat or vessel for commercial purposes any summer flounder during the period of 9:00 P.M. to 7:00 A.M.

Vessels seeking safe harbor shall contact the Marine Resources Commission Operations Station in advance of entry into Virginia waters. Any vessel declaring a need for safe harbor may be subject to inspection by the United States Coast Guard Marine Safety Office.
