RE: REDUCTION OF VIRGINIA'S 2010 HORSESHOE CRAB FISHERY

Effective 10:00 P.M., Eastern Standard Time (EST), Wednesday, June 16, 2010, the daily harvest and possession limits for horseshoe crabs will be reduced by 50%, as provided by Regulation 4 VAC 20-900-10 et seq. Effective 10:00 PM EST on June 16, 2010:

- It shall be unlawful for any person who holds a valid unrestricted horseshoe crab endorsement license to possess aboard any vessel in Virginia any number of horseshoe crabs in excess of 2,500 per day.
- It shall be unlawful for any person who holds a valid restricted horseshoe crab endorsement license to possess aboard any vessel in Virginia any number of horseshoe crabs in excess of 1,000 per day.
- It shall be unlawful for any person who holds a horseshoe crab bycatch permit to possess aboard any vessel more than 250 horseshoe crabs or for any vessel to land any number of horseshoe crabs in excess of 250 per day.

Based upon landing reports from Virginia seafood buyers and harvester call-ins, it is projected that Virginia will have caught 50% of 137,168 horseshoe crab quota by the above date and time.
