Fish On! Free Fishing Days Established for June 1-3, 2018

NEWPORT NEWS, VA – If you've always wanted to try fishing, now is your chance! You may fish without a license again this year, during the first weekend in June. Take advantage of the free fishing days, June 1, 2 and 3, 2018, and enjoy the great outdoors with your family and friends without having to spend money for a fishing license.

No fishing license of any kind will be required for recreational rod and reel fishing during free fishing days and facilities use permits will not be required during these dates. All fishing regulations, including size, season, catch limits, and gear restrictions, will remain in effect.

Matthew Strickler, Secretary of Natural Resources, said "we hope the public will take advantage of these three free fishing days to enjoy the richness and wonders of our Chesapeake Bay, lakes and rivers. We encourage parents will take their kids fishing; give them a memory that can last a lifetime. And to support Chesapeake Bay Awareness Week, there's no better way to raise awareness and appreciation for our natural resources than to get out and enjoy a day on the Chesapeake Bay."

"These free fishing days are an incentive for families and friends to get outside and enjoy our natural resources," said Steven Bowman, Virginia's Marine Resources Commissioner. "Virginia is blessed with spectacular fishing opportunities and we work hard create and maintain our saltwater fisheries so anglers have good chances of landing some fish. This goes to the heart of our conservation efforts."

The Marine Resources Commission's website, http://mrc.virginia.gov, has extensive information on Virginia's recreational fishing size, season and creel limits. Anglers who land unusually large saltwater fish may be eligible for special recognition through the agency's Saltwater Fishing Tournament by completing a free "Citation" application available from any of the over 80 official weigh stations. Additionally anglers can provide important catch information about their saltwater fishing trip by logging into https://www.vasaltwaterjournal.com/.

DGIF also has a fun way to recognize a trophy freshwater catch, called The Virginia Angler Recognition Program: http://www.dgif.virginia.gov/fishing/varp/. On average, anglers measure up over 6,000 trophy size fish annually. Since 1963, when the program began, over a quarter-million trophy fish awards have been issued.
