BRIEF EVENT PLAN SUMMARY:

This will be a coordinated salt-water fishing derby event at several locations throughout the Middle Peninsula involving the counties of Middlesex, King & Queen, Mathews, Gloucester and Essex. Following the morning fishing all participants will gather at the Holly Point Nature Park and Deltaville Maritime Museum.

The host organization will be the Middlesex Kiwanis Club (other clubs/organizations throughout the region will assist) in cooperation with the counties schools and Departments of Social Services. The event is designed to bring together special needs children and seniors in a shared fishing experience on the Chesapeake Bay and lower Rappahannock and York Rivers. The school system and DSS of each county will screen and provide qualified participants for the event.

Each county will provide transportation, as needed, to the enlisted marina(s) or static locations. Children and seniors will be pre-assigned to a specific boat; pairing to be based on the child's/senior's needs and the boats accommodations. Note: it is our policy to include an adult family member with each child and, when applicable, siblings. In some cases a healthcare assistant will be needed. It should be further noted that selected Marinas in Deltaville have agreed to host this event (provide dockage) for our boats.

Each boat will include a qualified chaperon or captain who will, during the three to four hour trip, cover basic fishing techniques and education about the environment and it's ecosystems including the stewardship needs of our waterways. Most of the fishing will be catch-and-release except, when possible, selected fish will be cleaned and packed so as to provide one family meal per

participant. Boats will include licensed charter and private owners (all must meet appropriate safety guidelines and participant liability waivers must be included with applications). There will be a select number of children and seniors who have special needs that will require assistance for the duration of the derby. Specific boats will be selected and paired up with these individuals and shall include an approved 'fishing buddy'. Fishing Buddies will be included in the covered expenses of the event as will minor siblings of special needs children. In the case of children attending who qualify for State mandated free/reduced lunch an adult family member or designee may be included in the covered cost of the event.

After the return from fishing transportation will be provided by county school busses to the Holly Point Nature Park and Deltaville Maritime Museum. After a brief break and tour of the facilities lunch will be served. Following lunch there will an awards ceremony and distribution of participant memorabilia. This will be followed by a brief presentation on the Chesapeake Bay and lower Rappahannock and York Rivers by a VIMS representative who will also discuss types of fish caught and more about our salt-water ecosystems. We will give awards to children and seniors who catch the most, largest, smallest and the most diverse type of fish. All will receive a participant certificate. In addition to the fishing supplies, children will receive a back pack of school supplies and seniors a goodie pack donated by local organization.
