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SPECIAL MANDATORY REPORTING ISSUE!



In the spring 2010 issue of the Commercial Fisheries Newsletter, you will find updates on several recently adopted regulations and upcoming fisheries topics, including changes to the black sea bass quota, a new horseshoe crab bycatch permit, and other management overviews. You will also find summaries on upcoming legislation from Richmond, new regulations, a note from the Virginia Marine Products Board, and information and directions about this year's striped bass tag breakage issue.

The remainder of this issue highlights the upcoming changes to the Mandatory Reporting Program that will begin later this year. Starting in the spring, new mandatory reporting forms and folders will be made available to commercial harvesters, aquaculture product owners, and seafood landing licensees. Examples of forms for crabs, finfish, aquaculture, and non-federally permitted species caught offshore are provided in this issue.

In the next few months, new forms will be mailed to you. Once you receive the new forms and folders, please discard any old forms and folders and submit your mandatory reports on the new 2010 forms. We will no longer accept mandatory reports on the old forms after September 5, 2010. To request new forms, please call and leave a message on the VMRC 1-800 line (1-800-937-9247).

The new compliance notification process will go into effect this spring. Please see page 14 for more details.

NMFS APPROVES BLACK SEA BASS QUOTA INCREASE FOR 2010

In November 2009, the 2010 coast-wide total allowable catch (TAC) (including landings and discards) for black sea bass was set at the same level as the 2009 TAC (2.71 million pounds).

However, on January 8, 2010, the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council's Scientific and Statistical Committee and the Black Sea Bass Monitoring Committee held a joint meeting to discuss the status of the 2010 black sea bass TAC, and the outcome of that meeting was a request to the NMFS for an emergency regulation to increase the TAC from 2.71 to 4.5 million pounds.

On February 9, 2010, the NMFS accepted that request and announced an increase to the 2010 black sea bass specifications by emergency rule. The emergency rule will be effective for 180 days, beginning February 10, 2010. NMFS may extend the emergency specifications for the remainder of the year through subsequent rulemaking.

What this means for Virginia fishermen is an increase in their 2010 commercial allocation from 218,638 pounds to 351,722 pounds for 2010. This is a significant increase in a fishery that has been cut multiple times in the past few years. The quota is divided into a directed fishery quota of 311,722 pounds and a bycatch fishery quota of 40,000 pounds. After May 1, 2010, the bycatch fishery quota will be reduced to 10,000 pounds, and any remaining quota will be transferred to the active members of the directed fishery.

NEW HORSESHOE CRAB AMENDMENTS BYCATCH PERMIT REQUIRED FOR 2010

On August 17, 2009, the horseshoe crab fishery in Th Virginia was closed. Virginia exceeded its horseshoe crab quota by 15,327 horseshoe crabs (10% overage), for 2009. This was the first year that the quota was exceeded, since ASMFC Addendum IV provisions were adopted by the Commission in

2006. Inadequate and untimely harvest reports were responsible for the quota overage.

To prevent future overages, Regulation 4 VAC 20-900-10 et seq. was amended pay back the 2009 overage, reduce the landing limit triggers from 85% to 50%, establish a bycatch permit, adjust reporting requirements for buyers, and establish additional landing limit triggers, for waters east of the COL-REGS line. These changes are detailed below:


- The 2010 quota is 137,168 horseshoe crabs. Pending no additional overages, the quota will return to normal levels in 2011.
- The landing limits on all permits will be reduced when 50% of the quota has been taken (compared to the previous 85%)
- The landing limits can be reduced specifically in waters east of the COLREGS Line
- A new bycatch permit is required for anyone who is harvesting horseshoe crabs and does not hold an endorsement license. Bycatch harvesters may land up to 500 horseshoe crabs/ day. This permit is not restricted.

STRIPED BASS TAG UPDATE

At the start of the 2010 commercial striped bass season, fisheries management was alerted by some fishermen that the striped bass tags were breaking during normal use, most often in an area just below the printed tabs. Virginia Marine Police were immediately notified of this issue.

After talking to the tag manufacture, the source of the problem has been identified as an error in the manufacturing process, in which the tags were not conditioned with moisture. This caused brittleness of the plastic. The manufacturer of the tags is working with staff to send replacement tags, but the arrival of these tags will not be until early April because of the company's schedules and delivery time.

Until these tags can be replaced, we ask that you do not lift the fish using the tag, bend the tag excessively in the area below the printed tab, or store the tags in areas where they will be exposed to temperatures below 35 degrees Fahrenheit. Please keep all of your broken tags so they can be re-



turned to VMRC and replaced with new tags.

To improve the flexibility of the tag, you can soak the tags in hot water (170 degrees Fahrenheit, do not boil) for about thirty minutes. This will increase the moisture levels of the tags and may help prevent them from breaking.

STRIPED BASS REGULATORY CHANGES

have been two significant regulatory changes. First, the 2010 bay striped bass quota was decreased by 6.5%. This is due to an estimated 6.5% reduction in the weight of available striped bass 18 inches and larger, as determined by the model that is utilized by Virginia Marine Resources Commission, Maryland Department of Natural Resources and the Potomac Rivers Fisheries Commission to determine the Bay wide striped bass quotas. For the 2010 commercial striped bass season there bass harvesters exceeding their quotas. Penalties are based on the amount of striped bass overage, by weight, and the number of overages the harvester has had (meaning less severe penalties for first-time offenders, and more severe penalties for repeat offenders). Instead of using the percentage of the quota for the individual's overharvest, the new system uses a predetermined range of weight overages. These new weight ranges can be found in regulation 4 VAC 20-252-155 (http://

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UPCOMING LEGISLATION

The Virginia General Assembly has passed several bills that impact commercial fishing in Virginia's saltwaters, and were signed into law by Gov. Robert F. McDonnell.

Two of the bills, House Bill 1291 and Senate Bill 192, would prohibit the Virginia Marine Resources Commission from issuing commercial fishing licenses or commercial fishing permits to residents of another state that do not offer the same or similar licenses or permits. Both bills passed the Virginia Senate and House of Delegates unanimously.

Another bill, Senate Bill 345, would authorize the Virginia Resources Authority to finance oyster restoration projects undertaken by local governments, should funding become available. The bill passed both chambers unanimously.

Two other bills would continue the current annual menhaden harvest, for reduction purposes, quota

of 109,020 metric tons from the Virginia portion of the Chesapeake Bay and would continue to manage the species from Richmond. Those bills, House Bill 142 and Senate Bill 47, passed with overwhelming support in both the Virginia Senate and House of Delegates.



SHARK UPDATE

Compliance with Addendum I to the Interstate Fishery Management Plan for Atlantic Coastal Sharks required a seasonal change in at-sea processing restrictions for smooth dogfish. From March 1 through June 30 of each year, commercial fishermen are allowed, in state waters, to continue to completely process smooth dogfish at sea. For the remainder of any year (July 1 through the end of February), commercial fishermen may completely remove the head, tail, pectoral fins, pelvic (ventral) fins, anal fin and second dorsal fin, but the first dorsal fin must remain naturally attached to the smooth dogfish carcass through landing. All sharks must be sold to a federally permitted buyer, and buyers and fishermen are required to identify all sharks to species level. Further, buyers are required to have attended a NMFS Shark Identification Workshop and must possess a valid Atlantic Shark Identification Workshop dealer certificate on the premises. It is unlawful to possess, on board a vessel, or to land in Virginia any species of shark, after NOAA Fisheries has closed the fishery for that species in Federal waters.

PROPOSED OYSTER REGULATION

In recent months, staff has worked with a committee of industry representatives and the Division of Shellfish Sanitation to develop a new regulation pertaining to restrictions on shellfish. Oyster harvest times are restricted to different times in the morning based on the average temperature of the months May through September. Harvest and even oyster husbandry outside of those time limits will be significantly restricted. The proposed regulation will be heard at the April Commission meeting.

- Oyster harvests after the morning curfew will be limited to a 3-hour period (from the time leaving the dock to return to the dock) only if the harvester gets a special permit from VMRC and has an approved GPS track logger to verify the trip. The GPS track loggers are \$100-\$150 each and are available from a number of sources.
- Icing on the boat will no longer be allowed to extend the harvest period beyond the daily cutoff time because it was not possible to develop icing standards that could be enforced in Court.
- A special permit will be required to move and handle wild oyster seed after May 1st, since portions of this activity will likely occur after the daily harvest time limit has passed.
- A special Cage Oyster Aquaculture Husbandry permit will be required for cage aquaculturists to handle oysters for routine husbandry after the daily time limit from May through September.
- A significant amount of additional recordkeeping is also being required of all harvesters and certified shellfish dealers from May through September.

AMENDMENTS TO SUMMER FLOUNDER REGULATIONS

On February 23, 2010, the Commission approved 1) Possess on board any vessel, in Virginia waamendments to Regulation 4 VAC 20-620-10 et seq. "Pertaining to Summer Flounder" that included new provisions for the offshore summer flounder bycatch fishery. Only vessels holding a valid Virginia Summer Flounder Endorsement License may possess summer flounder.

Effective March 1, 2010, during any time period not designated as an open directed offshore summer flounder season, it shall be unlawful for any person harvesting summer flounder outside of Virginia's waters to:

- ters, any amount of summer flounder, in excess of 10%, by weight, of Atlantic croaker or the combined landings, on board a vessel, of black sea bass, scup, squid, scallops and Atlantic mackerel.
- 2) Possess aboard any vessel, in Virginia waters, any amount of summer flounder, in excess of 1,500 pounds, landed in combination with Atlantic croaker.
- 3) Fail to land and sell the vessel's entire harvest of all species on board the vessel at the point of landing.

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VIRGINIA MARINE PRODUCTS BOARD HEADS TO BOSTON

The Virginia Marine Products Board will be heading to Boston to exhibit at The International Boston Seafood Show on March 14th to 16th at the Boston Convention & Exhibition Center.

There are eight companies from Virginia along with the Virginia Marine Products Board that will be exhibiting this year. They are Cherrystone Aqua-Farms, Chesapeake Bay Packing, L.L.C., Icelandic USA, Inc., J & W. Seafood of Virginia, Little River Seafood, Inc., Maritime Products International, Shore Seafood, Inc., and Wanchese Fish Company.

The Virginia Marine Products Board will be displaying Virginia seafood along with Chesapeake Ray. A sampling of the new breaded Chesapeake Stingers will be served up by Chef John Maxwell.

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MANDATORY REPORTING GUIDELINES



NEW MANDATORY REPORTING FORMS AND FOLDERS FOR 2010

Beginning in spring 2010, new mandatory reporting forms and folders will be made available to commercial harvesters, aquaculture product owners, and seafood landing licensees. In addition to meeting the new mandatory reporting requirements, the updated forms are designed to facilitate the process of filling out the reports and eliminate common errors associated with incomplete reports. The most notable changes include a designated field on the form for listing an agent, and a designated field for listing up to 5 helpers. Additionally, abbreviations for the unit amount (*e.g.* lbs, bu, nu) can simply be circled instead of written out on the form.



1-800-LINE INFORMATION



The VMRC Interactive Voice Response System (IVRS) (1-800-937-9247) is available for harvesters to report no activity, immediate harvest information for required species (such as black sea bass, horseshoe crabs, spiny dogfish, and American shad bycatch), request forms and folders, and to leave messages for license information. When using the IVRS, please remember to provide your name and VMRC ID. If you are providing information for multiple watermen, please speak each name and VMRC ID clearly and slowly. Listen carefully to the recording for the correct option and required information that you must provide.

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Please remember the following when filling out monthly mandatory reports:

COMMERCIAL FISHERMAN REGISTRATION LICENSEES

Mandatory fields to be filled out by harvester:

- VMRC ID and name of the registered commercial fisherman
- VMRC ID and name of any agent, if used
- VMRC ID and name of no more than five helpers who were not serving as agents
- Buyer or private sale information
- Vessel identification (Coast Guard documentation number or VA registration number)
- Vessel name (if applicable)
- Public rock abbreviation (if applicable)
- Lease number for aquaculture (oyster and clams) harvested from private grounds (if applicable)

- City or county where harvest was landed
- Date of harvest
- Water body fished
- Number of hours any gear was fished
- Gear type and amount of gear used
- Number of hours the registered commercial fisherman fished
- Number of crew on board, including captain
- Species harvested, market category
- Live weight or processed weight of species harvested
- Information on the price paid for the harvest may be provided voluntarily

BLUE CRABS

- Only one gear per ticket (e.g. harvest from crab pots and peeler pots should be written on separate tickets)
- Report peelers and soft crabs in numbers

FINFISH



- For anchored gill net (AGN), be sure to include number of nets and total amount in feet
- Specify the number of hooks when using trotlines
- Be sure to include the number of tags when harvesting striped bass
- Receipts must be included for striped bass sold as retail when the amount sold is more than 10 lbs

- Include the rock abbreviation (e.g, BURP), do not include the water code number (e.g., 345)
- Report all oysters in bushels



Mandatory fields to be filled out by aquaculture product owners:

- The VMRC ID and name of the seafood landing licensee
- VMRC ID and name of no more than five helpers who were not serving as agents
- Buyer or private sale information
- Include the lease number, not the plat number, of the grounds from which the oysters or clams were harvested. This number can be found on your billing statement from the VMRC.
- City or county of landing
- Date of harvest
- Water body fished
- Record the grow out period (seed to market) in the field, 'hrs gear fished' (OPTIONAL)
- Gear type
- Number of crew on board, including captain
- Species harvested, market category
- Live weight or processed weight of species harvested
- Information on the price paid for the harvest may be provided voluntarily

COMPLIANCE NOTIFICATION PROCESS FOR 2010

The new automated compliance notification process will be initiated in 2010. Based on a harvester's reporting history, this notification process will automatically generate postcards which will serve as reminders for submitting mandatory reports.

Details for the new notification process are outlined below:

- \Rightarrow If a mandatory report is not submitted by the 5th of the following month, then a 1st notification postcard will be generated and mailed to the harvester.
- \Rightarrow If a mandatory report is not received after the 1st notification, then a 2nd notification postcard will be generated and mailed to the harvester.
- \Rightarrow If a mandatory report is not submitted after a 2nd notification has been issued, then the harvester may be requested to appear before the Commission.
- \Rightarrow This notification process will be put in place to ensure the timeliness and accuracy of submitting mandatory reports to VMRC.

BE SURE TO SUBMIT MANDATORY REPORTS, INCLUDING REPORTS OF 'NO ACTIVITY' BY THE 5TH OF THE FOLLOWING MONTH!
